With Accessibility Services located in NHTI's Academic Center for Excellence (ACE), you're a step away from a great resources available to all students!

We offer free tutoring programs for students in need of extra help or looking to further their educational goals.

Our tutoring program include open labs and tutorials for Anatomy and Physiology and biological sciences, Math Lab, Writing Center, Study Skills, peer tutoring, and group study sessions.

During tutorial sessions, you can ask questions, learn at your own pace, and receive immediate feedback.

If you want to discuss academic support offerings, meet with an ACE tutor to talk about your learning strengths and challenges. We'll help refresh your essential study skills such as organizing time and materials, taking lecture notes, reading and studying textbooks, and preparing for tests.

Accommodations for Success



Welcome to Accessibility Services – we're here to support you in achieving your goals at NHTI!

You're encouraged to disclose the nature of your accessibility issue to the Accessibility Services coordinator prior to your

first semester at NHTI.

People have different learning styles and challenges. We create plans to suit your individual needs. Reasonable accommodations are provided to help you achieve at a level limited only by your abilities — not your disabilities.

It's our mission to provide equal educational access, opportunities, and experiences to all students with documented accessibility issues who register with our office. Assistance is provided in a collaborative way to help you develop strong, effective, and independent learning and self-advocacy skills as you assume responsibility for reaching your academic goals.

Accessibility Services can support your goals and program of study through:

- A Letter of Accommodation
- Academic coaching
- Assistive technology and equipment loans
- Referrals for diagnostic testing
- Requests for reduce course loads
- Verification of health insurance for athletic participation.

In compliance with Section 504 of the 1972 Rehabilitation Act and the Americans with Disabilities Act of 1991, NHTI does not discriminate against students with disabilities in terms of program admissions and/or opportunities for academic success.

You could qualify for assistance if you have:

- A diagnosed disability
- A history of a disability, but have not received service
- A history of difficulties in school
- A learning disability, ADD, or other accessibility issue.



Documentation is required; some restrictions apply. Eligibility is determined by the Accessibility Services coordinator. Accessibility Services records are confidential and kept separate from the Registrar, Admissions, and other department records.

You're given equal opportunity to pursue programs of study and are evaluated with the same course objectives as other students. Accommodations such as extended testing time and separate quiet testing environments may help you achieve course objectives.

The Process:

1. Contact Accessibility Services for a Letter of Accommodation application.
2. Fill out the application, obtain your required documentation, and submit them.
3. If you qualify for accommodations, the coordinator will work with you to complete a Letter of Accommodation.

We recognize that needs and barriers can evolve as you progress through your academic program. If you seek to modify a current accommodation plan, please contact us to review your needs.

Once you get your Letter of Accommodation, provide a copy to your instructors and meet with them to discuss how your academic needs will be met. This process has to be repeated each semester and for each class where you want to use your accommodations.

We want to support you as you achieve your goals at NHTI!

There are many options available through our Accessibility Services department, including:

- Academic coaching and study strategies
- Progress checks
- Time management strategies
- Equipment loans for digital recorders, smart pens, laptops, and calculators
- Software such as voice-to-text Dragon naturally Speaking, Inspiration, Text-to-Voice Kurzweil 3000, natural readers, ereaders, and Zoomtext
- Alternative textbooks such as etexts and audio books

Availability of these resources varies based on the current needs of our students.
